Pursuant to Rule 41-2.012, FAC, the Palm Beach MPO shall appoint an elected official to serve as the official Chairperson for all Coordinating Board meetings. The appointed chairperson shall be an elected official within Palm Beach County and shall serve until their elected term of office has expired or they are otherwise replaced by the MPO. Commissioner Paulette Burdick has served as the chair for three years and has asked the MPO to appoint a new chair.

2. Project 4371691 for design to widen the Turnpike Mainline from Atlantic Ave to Boynton Beach Blvd from six to eight lanes at a cost of \$8,000,000.

1. REGULAR ITEMS

Chair Haynie called the meeting to order at 9:02 a.m.

1.A. Roll Call

The recording secretary called the roll. (Attendance is listed in Exhibit A.)

Chair Haynie welcomed back to the Board Commissioner Abrams, Commissioner Richards and Councilman Valuntas, and welcomed newly appointed Commissioner McKinlay.

MOTION to adopt the agenda. Motion by Commissioner Taylor, seconded by VICE Mayor Berger, and carried unanimously. Mayor Triolo, Commissioner Fitzpatrick, Commissioner Materio, Mayor Glickstein, Vice Mayor Jablin and Deputy Mayor Scott absent.

1.E. **APPROVED:** Minutes for December 8, 2014

MOTION to approve the Minutes for December 8, 2014. Motion by Vice Mayor Berger, seconded by Councilmember Harrison, and carried unanimously. Mayor Triolo, Commissioner Fitzpatrick, Commissioner Materio, Mayor Glickstein, Vice Mayor Jablin and Deputy Mayor Scott absent.

1.F. Special Presentation - Bicycle Month Proclamation

Mr. Uhren introduced Ms. Franchesca Taylor, Bike/Ped/TDM coordinator with the Palm Beach MPO. Ms. Taylor spoke on the newly launched BikePalmBeach.org website and highlighted special events planned to promote bicycling.

Commissioner Fitzpatrick joined the meeting at 9:06 a.m.

Chair Haynie read the Palm Beach MPO Proclamation declaring March 2015 Florida Bicycle Month.

Commissioner Materio and Deputy Mayor Scott joined the meeting at 9:07 a.m.

1.G. Comments from the Chair

Chair Haynie said that:

Because she serves as the chair of the statewide MPOAC she was appointed as vice chair to the steering committee for the Florida Plan.

1.H. Executive Director's Report

Mr. Uhren said that:

- Palm Tran Connection service changed to the new contractors effective February 1, 2015. The County assumed dispatch responsibility and introduced 231 new vehicles to active service this week, driven and maintained by three new contractors to provide a more efficient and reliable experience for its riders.
- FY 15 Work program amendments going through admin approval will fund \$1.37M resurfacing of East Main Place in Pahokee, \$1.41M resurfacing of MLK Blvd in South Bay, and \$512K resurfacing of South Canal Street in Belle Glade. These state funded projects are implementing the \$9M allocated in FY 15 to the Rural Areas of Opportunity Program and the Small County Outreach Program.
- He had the pleasure of meeting Eric Dumbau, FAU's Director of Transportation and Livability, for lunch last month. Mr. Dumbau recently informed him that on Monday February 23 at 4 pm at FAU's Boca Raton campus there will be a presentation entitled "Engineering Livable Communities." Additional information is at the sign-in table and will be e-mailed to you later today.
- He provided a few items to the Board this morning as general information – the annual update to Florida Transportation Trends and Conditions report was distributed by FDOT, the polished version of the MPOAC legislative priorities and policy positions which were presented to you in December, and the NACTO urban street design guidelines which will be discussed under item 3.B.

Mayor Triolo joined the meeting at 9:18 a.m.

- He recognize the efforts of MPO staff and the agency partners to pull off the first MPO rolling retreat in January. It was an all hands on deck effort and he specifically thanked SFRTA, the City of Boca Raton, FDOT, the City of Delray Beach and Palm Tran for their hard work and dedication. He was interested in hearing any feedback regarding the retreat especially regarding the overall length and the location and topics covered.

Mayor Abby Brennan of the Village of Tequesta advised that the Village Council had passed a resolution to reduce US 1 in the village from six to four lanes and add bike lanes. She thanked Kim Delaney and Michael Busha from the Treasure Coast Regional Planning Council for their help and also thanked the Town of Jupiter for approving a similar resolution.

Commissioner Richards said he supported bicycle lanes.

Commissioner Materio said everyone could learn from the leadership in Tequesta.

- 4.A.2 Commissioner McKinlay requested the Hamlin Rd multipurpose pathway project be reprioritized. She said the project is ranked #22 and children in the area need a safe route between the County regional park and the bus stop.
 - 4.A.3 Councilman Willhite said Southern Blvd did not have deceleration lanes in the eastbound portion between SR 7 and the Turnpike. Mr. Uhren noted that the TIP includes construction of improvements at Southern Blvd and Sansbury's Way/Lyons Rd to provide an eastbound right turn lane and a second westbound left turn lane in FY 2018. He also noted that the draft FDOT work program includes construction of westbound right turn lanes at the Turnpike intersections in FY 20 and an update to the SR 80 corridor action plan from US 27 to I-95 in FY 16. Mr. Uhren said he would pass along concerns to the Traffic Division for better signal coordination.
- 4.A.4 Councilwoman Davis announced this would be her last meeting and Councilman Cedrick Thomas would be representing the City of Riviera Beach on the MPO Board. She would be the alternate if re-elected.
- 4.A.5 Commissioner James presented two-hundred and forty-six petitions from West Palm Beach residents opposing the extension of the SR 7 north to Northlake Blvd.
