- Southbound Alternate A1A/Old Dixie Hwy. traffic wishing to travel west on Hood Rd. will be directed to travel west on Donald Ross Rd. to Military Trail and travel south on Military Trail to access Hood Rd.
- Westbound Hood Rd. traffic will be directed to travel north on Alternate A1A/Old Dixie Hwy. to Donald Ross Rd., travel west on Donald Ross Rd. to Military Trail and travel south on Military Trail to access Hood Rd.
- Eastbound Hood Rd. traffic will be directed to travel north on Military Trail to Donald Ross Rd., travel east on Donald Ross Rd. to Alternate A1A/Old Dixie Hwy. and travel south on Alternate A1A to access Hood Rd.
